Three New Deacons for the Southwest

The Rt. Rev. Frederick G. Morrison ordained three men in Arizona parishes to the Sacred Order of Deacons on June 27th at the final Mass of the Synod of the Diocese of the Southwestern States at Christ Church, Carefree, Arizona.

All three will serve in the Diocese of the Southwestern States. Mark Williams holds a Master's Degree in Theology and is a Lay Reader and Vestryman at Christ Church, Carefree. Dr. William Hearter is a radiologist and Lay Reader in St. Nicholas Mission, Scottsdale. And John LesCallett will be Deacon-in-Charge of Atonement Mission in Fountain Hills and will continue as the Bishop's Stewardship Advisor.

Each of these men were sponsored by their community of faith, and their ministries are much anticipated by the communities in which they will serve.✠

The Archbishop Visits the Cathedral Parish

The Cathedral Parish of Christ the King welcomed its rector, Archbishop Provenca, for a visit on Rogation Sunday, May 5th. The Archbishop celebrated the Eucharist and preached at the Sunday service.

During his weekend in Washington, D.C., the Archbishop joined members of the parish on Saturday night for a pot-luck supper held at the home of Margaret and Franz Oppenheimer in Georgetown near the church. During the dinner, while enjoying a lovely spring evening in the garden behind the Oppenheimers' house, the Archbishop discussed his vision of the parish's future after the departure of its current clerical ministers. This chance to have an extended conversation about their parish and its life was particularly welcome.



After the Sunday service and before moving downstairs to the parish hall, the Archbishop blessed the new sign that had just been placed on the front of the church building.

This new sign, the fruit of the efforts of John and Gloria Grazioso, will make the church a more striking presence on its block at 2727 O Street, N.W., in Georgetown.

This pre-Civil War building, built by its congregation of freed Blacks, deserves to be better known. Though some school groups have visited this stop on the Underground Railroad, it is often over-looked when people pass down the street. Perhaps the new face of the parish will make it more noticeable to those who pass along the brick sidewalk out front.

The Cathedral Parish should be on the itinerary of any member of the APCK who visits Washington, D.C.

As our titular cathedral and oldest church building, it holds a special place among the sanctuaries of the Anglican Province of Christ the King.

2013 Eastern Seminar

St. Joseph of Arimathea Theological College



The Anglican Province of Christ the King is committed to theological education. This autumn the seminary will again offer a one-week seminar at the Cathedral Parish in Georgetown, Washington, D.C. From Monday, September 30, through Friday, October 4, we will hold the daily seminary round of Morning Prayer, Class, Midday Mass, Class and Evening Prayer. Worship will be held in the Cathedral Parish and instruction will take place in the undercroft parish hall.

Classes will be offered in Old Testament, New Testament, Ethics, Church History and other topics of interest to those preparing for ministry or wanting to deepen their training to strengthen their ministry. These topics reflect the seminary's year-round online program, aiding the ordinand in effective use of his online studies. Nothing can replace the steady work of scriptural, historical, and theological study required to prepare for examinations and subsequent vows, and these two academic programs complement one another.

The faculty for this session include:

- ⊕ Mr. Paul Evans, doctoral student in Medieval Studies at The Catholic University of America.
- ⊕ The Rev. Dr. Paul S. Russell, Dean of the Cathedral Parish of Christ the King.
- ⊕ The Rev. Dr. J. Albert Starr, Associate Priest at the Cathedral Parish of Christ the King.
- ⊕ The Rt. Rev. Dr. John E. Upham, Jr. Suffragan Bishop for the Diocese of the Atlantic States.

The cost for the one week session will be \$150. Students must find their own accommodations in the city and their meals near the parish.

Those individuals who wish to apply for the 2013 Eastern Seminar should contact their bishop to ensure that their program takes place in the context of Diocesan ministry.
